R re-assure and Re-integrate	Try to reassure without letting teacher know all your opinion; even if they know you thought some / all teaching was effective (to reassure him/her) they still have to work out what and why		
E establish focus on Objectives (personal and for pupil learning)	Focus should be on the ILOs and pupils' learning		
 V visit (their understanding) through questions What went well? For what reason? What went less well? For what reason? 	Get teacher to think about importance of lesson plan to success or otherwise of lesson Link questions to school objectives, and particularly those that were a focus of the lesson and part of the teacher's targets OR a more open-ended approach can be used and the teacher can set the 'agenda' — do they pick up on what you expected? Note the strength / perception of teacher answers for evidence of understanding		
I input – your own contribution	If / when the teacher has run out of ideas; points to make, move to a more direct 'leading' (telling) style		
E emphasise and summarise	What have you learnt from today? Draw discussions towards the 'W'		
W "What will you now do?"	Set agreed SMART targets and how they can be actioned
